1. SUSINIMA HOUSES OF SIBIU + BUCHAREST

This year, SUS INIMA houses hosted oncology patients from 18 counties in Romania and included patients from Ukraine and the Republic of Moldova.

The SUS INIMA houses offer free accommodation and meals during the radio or chemo+radio treatment period.

797 beneficiaries of Sus Inima houses (45% M / 55% F)

2673 nights accommodation

1580 hot meals offered



2. ONCOLOGICAL SUPPORT CENTER

1101 hours of therapy sessions for cancer patients and their relatives (Oncological navigation, psychotherapy sessions, psychological support groups, art therapy, nutritional therapy)

12 art therapy sessions

16 nutrition sessions

48 cases of second opinion

52 psychological support groups

218 psychotherapy sessions

660 files reviewed by oncological navigators



3. PATRONAGE

17 cases of patients who needed specialized interventions abroad, expenses borne from own funds and fundraising activity in the amount of 412.280 RON.

1. HALA ZACARIA

developed in partnership with Valletta Park, Sibiu Community Foundation, CSU FANS and Sibiul for all.

Hala Zacaria was opened from 01.03.2022 - 01.07.2022 and served the needs of a community of approximately **3,600 people** with food, hygiene products, clothing, toys, books, etc.

Initiative supported by own funds, donations and partnerships with RED CROSS ROMANIA, KAUFLAND ROMANIA, LIDL ROMANIA.



2. 'One community' educational center was opened from 01.04.2022 - 01.09.2022 and provided access to educational services for 56 children from Ukraine, thus providing the opportunity for adults to find employment. The children received hot meals, snacks and could benefit from education in their native language facilitated by educators hired from the ranks of refugees from Ukraine.

3. Romanian and English language courses developed in partnership with the Sibiu Community Foundation and "Lucian Blaga" Sibiu University, SOS Kinderdorfer

The initiative is ongoing and involves the development of language course modules suitable for native Ukrainian speakers. They are able to study English and Romanian. 327 persons have benefited from these courses until now.

Initiative financed from own funds and OXFAM.



4. Ukrainian Kindergarten Sibiu developed in partnership with FRAM SCHOOL

Ongoing initiative. The Ukrainian kindergarten group, for children between the ages of 3-6, attended by **68 children** who benefit from educational services in their mother tongue, facilitated by six Ukrainian educators.

Initiative financed from own funds, STEP BY STEP and RED CROSS.



5. Ukrainian educational centers Sibiu

- developed in partnership with the Evangelical Parish Gușterita Sibiu and the Sibiu Inspectorate.

Ongoing initiative. The initiative has 2 components, primary school and secondary school, respectively high school. This educational system includes 192 Ukrainian children, respectively 31 teachers and auxiliary staff from Ukraine. The children go to school between 08:00 and 17:00, they receive a hot lunch and all the necessary educational and didactic material. The Ukrainian parents are co-funding these projects by paying an educational fee of 50 Euro/month/child. Additionally costs are covered through SUS INIMA own funds, Deutscher Schulverein "Friedrich-Wilhelm Raiffeisen", CANPACK Romania, SWISS SOLIDARITY, IFM EFECTOR SRL, SOS Kinderdorf Romania.



6. Temporary accommodation for refugees from Ukraine. Temporary accommodation for refugees from Ukraine and their pets.

Ongoing initiative. Since the beginning of the crisis of the war in Ukraine 78 direct beneficiaries (pet owners) + 89 pets have been accommodated.

Initiative financed from own funds and HUMANE SOCIETY.



7. Ukrainian Info Point

project carried out in partnership with the Club of German Businessmen in Sibiu.

Ongoing initiative. The information point is a space for meeting and holding information sessions about the most important aspects: legal, medical, social, about which refugees from Ukraine need to be informed, 5680 direct beneficiaries (persons looking for social, educational, psychological, medical information and facilitation of access to such services), 270 direct beneficiaries for the Ukrainian Library, 160 direct beneficiaries of self defense and personal development courses (how to's on self defense, anxiety and stress, PTSD, sexual development, sexual harassment etc), 1969 direct beneficiaries - persons included in the Group "Ukrainians in Slbiu", that is coordonated by SUS INIMA personnel and volunteer staff.

Initiative financed from own funds.



8. SUSINIMA.PLAYS

Project carried out in partnership with national and international artists and innovative cultural and social workers.

Ongoing initiative. The project aims for social inclusion through performance art
The workshops will be focused on games-like activities, that will help the participants develop new skills in a fun and creative way.

SusInima Plays workshops start from the 1st of November 2022 and will be held daily in designated spaces for designated groups. The facilitators of workshops are professional award-winning directors, actors, musicians, dancers who are accompanied by Romanian and Ukrainian therapists and translators.
